The City Manager is authorized to make changes to these plans as he deems necessary in keeping with the nature of the event and as circumstances dictate.

Motion <u>M2018-43</u> to accept a collaboration grant from TD Bank and the Arbor Day Foundation in the amount of \$20,000 for the purpose of making improvements at Myrtle's Market to create a park setting and provide educational programs about the importance of trees/shrubs and how to maintain them, as well as the importance of vegetable gardening. No local match required.

Motion <u>M2018-44</u> to accept a grant from SC DHEC (South Carolina Department of Health and Environmental Control) in the amount of \$11,430 on behalf of the City's Solid Waste Department for the purchase of two roll-off recycling containers and the relocation of two existing utility poles to make room for the new containers. 
