1 R2018-11: A RESOLUTION DECLARING AN EXTRAORDINARY EVENT, AND 2 DIRECTING THE MANAGER TO TAKE ALL STEPS **NECESSARY** FOR PRESERVATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY WELFARE FROM JUNE 1, 3 2018 THROUGH JUNE 13, 2018 - CAROLINA COUNTRY MUSIC FESTIVAL. 4 5 Applicant/Purpose: Staff/ to declare the Carolina Country Music Festival as an 6 Extraordinary Event. 7 8 Brief: 9 Pursuant to Ordinance 2015-31 an extraordinary event is: A large-scale organized rally or event of national or international 10 significance. 11 12 An unpermitted rally/event that would otherwise be declared a special 13 event due to its impact on public health, safety & welfare. An event w/a history of attracting a significant # of vehicles & people to 14 15 a certain area. In such an actual or threatened occurrence, Council may declare an 16 17 extraordinary event, fix the location & establish the time of such event. 18 The extraordinary event declaration expires w/in 96 hours of issuance. 19 This proposed resolution declares the Country Music Festival as an extraordinary 20 event (June 1 - June 13, 2018) 21 22 Issues: 23 Upon declaration of an extraordinary event, the Manager/designee(s) may Request assistance from federal, state & other bcal governments. 24 Hire additional law enforcement officers & private security officers. 25 Resolve questions of authority & responsibility of such personnel. 26 0 27 Require businesses in designated areas to employ private security officers. 28 Utilize public or private property when there is a compelling necessity for the protection of lives, health & welfare. 29 o Facilitate non-consensual towing of vehicles & motorcycles. 30 31 Require temporary cessation of operation of businesses w/in the event 32 boundaries (from 11 PM. - 6 AM. unless circumstances compel otherwise). o Temporarily divert pedestrian & vehicular traffic. 33 o Establish & enforce no cruising zones, & a temporary cruising prohibition. 34 Access to rooftops w/in the boundaries of the event shall be restricted to 35 personnel deemed essential for the operation of said business, business equipment, 36 37 &/or business appliances, & shall be escorted by a law enforcement officer. 38 39 Public Notification: Normal meeting notification. 40 41 **Alternatives:** 42 Amend proposed resolution. 43 Deny proposed resolution. 44 45 Financial Impact: None from this action.

## **RESOLUTION R2018-11**

CITY OF MYRTLE BEACH COUNTY OF HORRY STATE OF SOUTH CAROLINA RESOLUTION DECLARING AN EXTRAORDINARY EVENT, AND DIRECTING THE MANAGER TO TAKE ALL STEPS NECESSARY FOR THE PRESERVATION OF PUBLIC HEALTH, SAFETY, WELFARE FROM JUNE 1, 2018 THROUGH JUNE 13, 2018 - CAROLINA COUNTRY MUSIC FESTIVAL.

Whereas, pursuant to Ordinance No. 2015-31, enacted on 4-28-15, an Extraordinary Event means an organized large-scale rally or special event of national or international significance; or an unpermitted rally or event that would be declared a special event under this chapter due to its impact on public health, safety and welfare, were it to be organized, or an event named or unnamed that has a history of attracting or is expected to attract a significant number of vehicles and people to a certain portion of the City in congregation and congestion, thereby placing the public health, safety and welfare in jeopardy; or a declared state of civil emergency by the County of Horry, which would impact the City of Myrtle Beach, and thus implicate the application of Chapter 8 of the Code of Ordinances of Myrtle Beach; and

Whereas, in the event of an actual or threatened occurrence of an Extraordinary Event, which may result or has resulted in the immediate past history in loss of life, personal injury, property damage or destruction and in the major disruption of routine community affairs, business or governmental operations in the city and which is of sufficient severity and magnitude to warrant extraordinary assistance by federal, state and local departments and agencies to supplement the efforts of available public and private resources, the City Council may declare an Extraordinary Event, fix location or boundaries of the Extraordinary Event, and establish the period of time of the Extraordinary Event. The Manager may act under this Ordinance from June 1, 2018, by transmitting the orders and conditions to all city employees. The declaration of any Extraordinary Event shall expire June 13, 2018; and

Whereas, as defined in Ordinance, the permitted performance of any person, group or ensemble with an anticipated attendance of greater than 10,000 attendees may be declared to be an Extraordinary Event.

Now, therefore, be it resolved and declared that the Country Music Festival of June 1, 2018 through June 13, 2018 is an Extraordinary Event due to its anticipated and historic impact.

Be it further resolved that:

Consistent with a declaration of an Extraordinary Event, the Manager or the person designated by Council may request the assistance from the Federal, state and other local governments to provide assistance, provided that the impact of the Extraordinary Event has been or is anticipated to be beyond the capacity of the city to meet adequately and outside agency assistance is necessary to supplement local efforts to save lives and protect property, public health and safety, or to avert or lessen the negative impact of the Extraordinary Event on the citizens; and

Further, upon declaration of an Extraordinary Event, the City Manager, or designee(s), in order to promote public health, safety, welfare and order, and to protect lives, minimize criminal activity, and maximize the efficiency of providing municipal services, may:

- (i) Hire, enlist, contract, employ or appoint temporary armed Registered Private Security Officers, in addition to law enforcement persons and agencies, and resolve questions of authority and responsibility that may arise among them in deployment as part of a County-wide plan;
- (ii) Require hoteliers and retail operation within the designated areas to employ Registered Private Security Officers, to maintain order and control entry on their property;
- (iii)Utilize public property when there is compelling necessity for the protection of lives, health and welfare; and/or the property of citizens where public health, safety and welfare are placed in jeopardy due to the Extraordinary Event;
- (iv) Contract with and employ such businesses, human resources and lease, or otherwise provide for such properties so that non-consensual towing of vehicles and motorcycles may be efficiently achieved;
- (v) Establish and enforce by way of temporary governmental signage for the temporary cessation of the operation of retail sales businesses with the boundaries of the event, which shall not begin not earlier than eleven (11) p.m. of each night of the event, and shall be lifted no later than six (6) a.m. of each morning of the event, unless circumstances compel otherwise;
- (vi) Establish and enforce the temporary closing, blocking or diversion of pedestrian and vehicular traffic of such sidewalks, streets and roads within the City's police jurisdiction, through deployment of law enforcement and traffic control devices in order to minimize congestion and unlawful congregation. City Manager hereby authorizes the use of private lots to be used to meet the expected demand for additional parking to serve the Carolina Country Music Festival.
- (vii) Establish and enforce no cruising zones, and enforce a temporary prohibition of cruising on designated streets and roads; provided however, that first responders, governmental vehicles, public transportation vehicles, licensed vehicles for hire and vehicles used in licensed businesses in the delivery of service shall be exempt.

Further, the violation of any provision of this division, or in any rule, regulation, order or traffic device or restriction promulgated by any officer or agency of the city under authority duly

vested in him is declared to be unlawful as a misdemeanor, and shall be punished by a fine not exceeding \$500.00 or by imprisonment for a term not exceeding 30 days or both, in the discretion of the judge of the municipal court. Each incident of violation, rather than each day of violations, of any provision of this Code or of any such ordinance, resolution, rule, regulation or order shall continue shall constitute a separate offense.

Further, while any person who violates any provision of the Code may be issued a warning, citation or notice that the person is in violation of the Code within the discretion of law enforcement, and while any penalty for conviction of a violation lies solely within the discretion of the court, it is the will of City Council that the protection and preservation of the public health, safety and welfare of the public and first responders be paramount, and that enforcement of the imposed restrictions herein be made immediately effective so that the violations shall cease, and public peace and order be maintained.
