 - Assets includes improving publicly owned assets (i.e., public property), wayfinding signage, or place making projects.
 - o Programs includes programs developed by a city or in partnership w/ others including, but not limited to, downtown development or revitalization; business incubators or small business assistance.
- If awarded, the City would dedicate the grant towards the refurbishment of the two railroad cars located at the Train Depot.
