Re: Meeting Schedule and Agendas

- 1. Next week's meeting schedule and agendas are attached.** The Friday Fax link, above, works, but we're launching a new web site for the city, which should exist in a couple of days, at most. When that happens, you'll find the usual information in a brand-new design, once it's all in place. For that reason, you won't see the regular link below in Photos of the Week, although the weekly series will continue. Stay tuned!
- 2. The Myrtle Beach City Council holds a two-day retreat next week to talk about upcoming issues and get to know each other.** The retreat is set for Tuesday and Wednesday, January 30 and 31, in the second floor conference room at Magnolia's on 26th. See the attached agendas. Following the retreat, members of Council and staff will travel to Columbia to tour the EdVenture Children's Museum Thursday mid-day, then on to Greenville Thursday evening and Friday morning, where they will meet with city leaders and tour downtown Greenville's successful revitalization.
- 3. City Day next Saturday! Make plans to attend City Day from 10:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m., Saturday, February 3, at the Myrtle Beach Convention Center.** This entertaining and informative event is for residents of all ages. Learn about the city which provides your services and meet the people who are behind the scenes. Activities include demonstrations, "ted talks" about various city-related topics and much more. Admission is free and parking is complimentary.

4. **Changes are coming next month to Myrtle Beach’s solid waste collection zones.** Thanks to robust residential growth, especially on the south end (Zone 1 on Mondays), it’s time to re-balance the four collection zones so that they have a roughly equal number of customers. The city will keep the Monday-through-Thursday schedule, but 3,000 households will switch from one zone to another. Letters are going to each of the affected households, along with hang tags on pelicans to alert customers. 5. **Fifth Avenue South, between Boundary Street and Kings Highway, remains closed to through traffic for another few days.** Work on the sewer pump station is complete, but repaving a stretch of Fifth Avenue South at the work site will occur early next week. Detour signs are in place until Wednesday, January 31.
6. **Speaking of roads, Shine Avenue, between Farrow Parkway and Carlson Street, will be closed for a few days later next week.** Installation of water and sewer lines to serve the expanding Market Common residential community will occur Wednesday and Thursday, January 31 and February 1, requiring the closure. Detours will be posted.
7. **In other news, the first class for this year’s MyBeach 101 Citizens Academy will be held at 5:30 p.m., Thursday, February 1, at the Historic Myrtle Beach Colored School Museum and Education Center.** Thirty city residents were selected to participate. Also next week, the Myrtle Beach Police Department will hold two business watch meetings on Thursday, February 1, at the Train Depot. The sessions are at 10:00 a.m. and 2:00 p.m.
8. **Volleyball was the name of the game during the recent holiday weekend, and that’s the subject of our Photos of the Week.** Some 280 volleyball teams from around the Southeast filled the Myrtle Beach Sports Center and Convention Center for three days. The annual Winter Bump Volleyball Tournament brings thousands of players and visitors to Myrtle Beach. This example of indoor sports tourism included 32 full-sized volleyball courts covering 200,000 square feet of space between the two buildings. Again, as mentioned in item 1 above, we’re updating the web site, so these Photos of the Week will be available on the new home page in a day or two.
9. **Did you know...** That the Grand Strand Humane Society took in 2,301 stray and unwanted animals during 2017? Of that number, 1,034 pets found a new home through local adoptions. Another 774 pets were transferred to rescue partners for future adoptions. Owners reclaimed 235 pets, while 49 were spayed or neutered as part of the trap-neuter-release program (TNR). Only 105 animals were humanely euthanized due to health or behavioral issues. The shelter had a 92 percent live release rate in 2017, meaning that it’s consider a “no kill” shelter. The remaining pets from 2017 are still available for adoption.
