Brief:

- According to FEMA, local governments have the primary role of planning and managing all aspects of their community's recovery.
- The Recovery Framework acknowledges that recovery depends heavily on local planning, local leadership, and the whole community of stakeholders who support recovery.
- Communities need to be ready to act with recovery plans in hand in the fast-moving post-disaster period. The rapid change brought on by a disaster requires an equally rapid and adaptable post-disaster recovery process so communities are able to take advantage of opportunities to rebuild smarter.
- This short and long range disaster recovery plan will build on the City of Myrtle Beach Emergency Operations Plan and the individual department's emergency preparedness plans.
- The Recovery Plan is both a planning and an operations-based document that provides guidance for the short- and long-term aspects of recovery from a major disaster.
- This plan provides organizations involved in recovery with resources and operational guidance to recover from emergencies causing a significant impact to infrastructure, housing, the economy, and the health, social, cultural, historical, and environmental framework of the community.
- This plan will outline partners' activities and organization to promote recovery from an incident.

Issues:

- Recovery initiatives are the activities that take place during and after the disaster response phase of emergency management.
- Recovery involves meeting both the short-term and long-term needs of the community.
- Much of the support required for an effective response to community needs and recovery implementation tasks involves the coordination and administration of federal and state disaster assistance.
- This document should be applicable to any disaster, regardless of scope, size, or classification (e.g., presidentially declared disaster), but should also be scaled and updated appropriately.

According to NOAA, in 2021 (as of October 8), there have been 18 Financial Impact: weather/climate disaster events with losses exceeding \$1 billion per event. These events included: 1 drought, 2 floods, 9 severe storms, 4 tropical cyclones, 1 wildfire, and 1 winter storm. Overall, these events resulted in the deaths of 538 people.

TO ADOPT THE CITY OF MYRTLE BEACH DISASTER RECOVERY PLAN 2021

WHEREAS, according to the Federal Emergency Management Agency if accomplished properly, planning provides a methodical way to engage the whole community in thinking through the lifecycle of a potential crisis, determining required capabilities and establishing a framework for roles and responsibilities; and

WHEREAS, with a grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration the City contracted with Atkins Global Consulting to coordinate the development of a short and long term disaster recovery plan with input from the City's Emergency Management Division and other City Departments, county/state/federal emergency management agencies, hospitals, colleges and universities, chamber, hospitality association, regional council of governments, economic development agencies, and numerous non-profit agencies involved in disaster recovery efforts; and

WHEREAS, the City of Myrtle Beach Disaster Recovery Plan 2021 provides a flexible and scalable framework for organization and decision making before, during, and after all-hazard incidents causing a significant impact to infrastructure, housing, the economy, and the health, social, cultural, historical, and environmental framework of the community; and

WHEREAS, the Plan provides guidance for the City in coordination with local, state, and federal government agencies as well as non-governmental organizations to coordinate the federal, state, local, and private sector recovery from the long-term consequences of a disaster; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of the Plan is to: 1) Outline a framework potentially used to assist communities in rebuilding after a disaster while increasing the communities' ability to recover from future disasters and 2) Provide the coordination necessary for the recovery efforts of the City with other government agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Plan provides a draft Recovery Ordinance, for City Department and City Council consideration, establishing regulations for the orderly recovery of residents, businesses, and property in the city after a disaster and recommendations for the establishment of a Recovery Task Force to provide a coordination mechanism to oversee the recovery and reconstruction process serving as an advisory committee to the City of Myrtle Beach Emergency Management Division and other personnel responsible for recovery activities.
