City of Myrtle Beach established Floodplain Management & Hazard Mitigation

- Committee's role:
 - Meet annually to report activities accomplished in preceding 12 months to reduce flooding, better protect property, or improve response times after hurricanes, etc.
 - o Meet every 5 yrs. as required to update the plan for the sufficient number of times required to address all sections of the plan.
 - o Include representatives from the City from planning, public works, emergency management, construction services, risk manager, & police department.
 - Maintain at least 50% of the members representatives of the public or key stakeholders.
 - o Recommends additional actions to reduce flood damage.
 - o Formulates action plan for Council's approval.
 - o Implement actions approved by Council.
- FEMA now requests separate establishment of Committee through proposed resolution.
- Proposed resolution recognizes Floodplain Management & Hazard Mitigation Planning Committee as responsible for identifying & evaluating hazard risks & for determining ways to mitigate impacts.

- FEMA's CRS (Community Rating System) recognizes 10 "Classes" based on City's floodplain management risks & mitigation efforts.
- City's current rating is Class 5 requiring 2,501 CRS points.
- Passage of proposed resolution increases CRS points.
- Prerequisite for a Class 4 CRS community.
