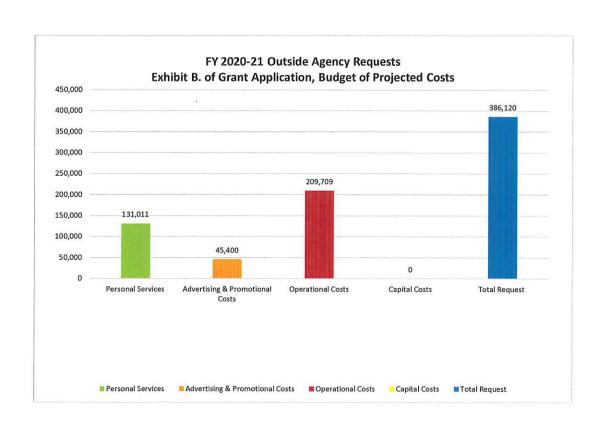

### **Program Objective:**

Our program objective is strengthening families by assisting with educational attainment and parenting education.

Family Outreach takes a unique approach in addressing poverty and its effects on the health of families. We recognize that where people live, their environment, genetics, income and education level, and relationships with friends and family all have considerable impacts on health. Our efforts over the past 37 years have led to the creation of our Family Resource Center.

The Family Outreach of Horry County collaborates with multiple agencies to work with families on the social problems that can lead to poor health and increase their chances of lifting themselves out of poverty.

Our Family Resource Center provides the following services:

- Parenting classes and support groups for young adult and teen parents
- Prenatal, childbirth and infant care education
- Assistance in enrolling in Horry County Adult Education and local Technical Colleges
- Assistance with enrolling in local job training opportunities
- · Referrals to Health and family planning services
- Assistance with ABC day care vouchers that allow mothers to work or attend school.
- SC Thrive Benefit Bank Site-aid in applying for government assistance such as Medicaid, Medicare, Food Stamps, Family Independence, and State & Federal Taxes etc.

Family Outreach served over 875 people in 2019 and 11% of those served live in the City of Myrtle Beach. In 2018 19% of those we served lived in the City of Myrtle Beach. These are pregnant and parenting teens and young adults. Several attend Myrtle Beach High School and met monthly with our Family Life Educator at the school. Our Health Educator meets with clients at the Family Justice Center or their homes.

Family Outreach is seeking grant funding to help with our expenses working with clients in Myrtle Beach.

Our services are educational and the majority of our expenses are paying educators.

**Program Objective:** To increase the number of rides for the City of Myrtle Beach residents from 1,530 to 2,010 for aging in place transit rides such as healthcare access and quality of life. 129 City of Myrtle Beach businesses were directly impacted by the award winning Neighbor to Neighbor volunteer driver model with 2,177 direct rides to their establishments. Based on data projections in 2020, N2N will likely increase the number of businesses to 140 and provide those businesses with 2,395 ride-in patrons.

**Program Objective:** The SOS Health Care, Inc. is requesting funds for our summer camp program. This is a summer long day-camp for children and teenagers with Autism and intellectual disabilities. Recently, a national study conducted by the National Survey of Children's Health concluded that the rate of Autism is 1 in 40, which is much higher than recent estimates. This increase makes our summer camp program even more important to the families in the Myrtle Beach area who have children with Autism and intellectual disabilities.

Our summer camp is designed specifically for individuals with Autism and intellectual disabilities and promotes inclusion of children with disabilities while encouraging a healthy lifestyle, fitness, social skills and activity. Summer camp helps children make new friends and improve their self-esteem and overall happiness.

While our program directly serves youth with Autism and intellectual disabilities, it also indirectly serves the parents of these children. This camp was designed because of a rising need in the Myrtle Beach community. Many of the parents we serve are unable to place their child in typical daycare or camp due to the nature of their child's disorder and a lack of specialized training at other facilities. Without proper childcare, parents are unable to continue working during the summer months when school is out of session. SOS's camp provides a safe, supportive environment with staff trained to assist those with Autism and intellectual disabilities. This allows parents to continue during the summer months.

In 2020, we hope to serve more families than in prior years, working specifically to reach out to families in Myrtle Beach. Each year, SOS has a waitlist of families needing our camp service. Our main barrier to providing this service to more families is a lack of funding to properly staff the camp to ensure it is save for additional campers to attend. We have never had a shortage of qualified individuals wishing to work in the camp program.

Due to the increased need for summer services for individuals with Autism and intellectual disabilities, camp has been split into two groups. The first group consists of children ages 4+. The children enjoy community outings to the Pepper Geddings Recreation Center, Mary C. Canty Recreation Center, Grand 14 Stone Theatre at Market Common, the Children's Museum of SC and more. On these outings, the children work on much needed social skills and are supervised by specifically trained staff. The campers also have a rigorous curriculum throughout the summer, which focuses on addressing social skill deficits as well as educational lessons. They have many opportunities to stay active which helps increase strength, endurance, and overall motor skills. In addition, guest speakers visit with the children and conduct activities revolving around topics such as service animals, gardening, equine therapy, and more.

The second group consists of teenagers with Autism and intellectual disabilities and focuses on skills and issues that affect teens including developing employment skills, fitness and nutrition, skills for independent living, social skills, hygiene and more. These campers visit local businesses including Jonny D's Waffles and Benedict's Grand 14 Stone Theatres at Market Common, Pelican's Stadium, and stores at Coastal Grand mall and Broadway at the Beach where they learn about various career opportunities at these businesses and develop skills for future employment.
